





- All AUT undergraduate degree offers require the following minimum University Entrance (UE) marks from the Certificate in Foundation Studies
- Achieve a minimum of 55% in English I, 60% in English IIA, 65% in English IIB and 50% in both Tertiary Study Skills and Culture and Society.
- Achieve 50% or better in four optional academic subjects (some degrees require higher marks).

### FOUNDATION CONNECT

Delivered by UP Education, Foundation Connect provides a comprehensive, English-rich curriculum to prepare students for the Certificate in Foundation Studies (Level 3). This six-month extension programme allows students to develop their English skills, confidence and apply these English skills in an academic setting. Foundation Connect includes engagement in Mathematics and academic courses to give students a broader foundation for future learning.

The programme is marketed as Foundation Connect and the programme name is registered as an "Intensive General English Course" at NZQA.

#### Course structure

There are two compulsory subjects (English and English for Mathematics) and two academic subjects per term. These academic subjects will be used to prepare students for their future academic studies and contextualise their academic English usage.

- English 11 hours per week
- English for Mathematics 3 hours per week and 1 Flexible Learning Activity (FLA)
- Academic subjects 3 live lessons and 1 FLA students do four academic subjects with two in the first term and two in the second term

The academic subjects available are usually:
Business; Science; Humanities (Geography) and Media.

#### Each term:

- English 9 live lessons per week
- Maths 3 live lessons and 1 FLA per week
- 2 Academic subjects 3 live lessons 1 FLA

#### Visas and offers

Foundation Connect students apply for their visa through UP International College New Zealand. Upon completion, they receive a firm offer for the Standard-length Certificate in Foundation Studies from AUT, with a visa issued by the university.

Students can also opt for a pathway visa covering all 3 courses:

- Foundation Connect
- The AUT Certificate in Foundation Studies
- AUT degree

#### Progression requirements

To accept your conditional offer for the AUT Certificate in Foundation Studies, students must meet the minimum progression grades:

- a minimum of 50% in English subjects
- a minimum of 45% in all academic subjects and an average of 55% across the same 3 academic subjects (Maths plus 2 others)

#### Some important notes:

In exceptional cases, students with outstanding work ethic and academic results may be considered for a fast-track program, subject to academic staff discretion.

If a student needs to re-sit subjects to meet progression grades, an individual study plan will be provided by the academic team. A student failing a Foundation Connect course more than twice cannot re-enroll.

#### Assesments

Foundation Connect will have a combination of internal assessments and exams with a minimum of 40% of the assessment weightings being exams.

### PATHWAYS LINK PROGRAMME

This programme aims to equip you with essential foundational knowledge, skills, and the confidence necessary to excel in your future Foundation studies. The accelerated one-year programme will offer successful students entry into the AUT Foundation Studies programmes. PLP is an innovative educational initiative designed specifically for international students aged 14–17 who have recently finished their junior high school education and aspire to study abroad.

Pathways Link is registered as 'Pathways Link - L1A and L1B (Level 1) (Training Scheme)' at NZQA.

#### Visa checking and monitoring

The Administrative Services Team is responsible for checking and monitoring the visa status of our students. They will send reminders to students whose visas are about to expire, communicate with Immigration New Zealand when there are errors on the visas.

#### Medical and travel insurance

The Education (Pastoral Care of Tertiary and International Learners) Code of Practice 2021 requires all international students studying in New Zealand to have appropriate health and travel insurance during their period of study.

Allianz Partners is our preferred insurance provider. Enrolled international students will be charged Allianz's Studentsafe Inbound University insurance premium when enrolment is completed. You must pay this fee unless the University approves the use of an alternative insurance provider.

You must have approved insurance for the duration of your study and covering the duration of their visa or until they depart New Zealand, whichever comes first.

Note: Your AUT student ID number is also your insurance policy number. You are not automatically covered for pre-existing medical conditions. However, cover can be arranged in certain circumstances on application to Allianz before your programme starts.

### **ACCOMMODATION**

#### Homestay

Available to all students, homestay is a great way of experiencing New Zealand culture and practising your English every day.

You will have your own room with a bed, desk, lamp and wifi, and all meals are included for full-board homestay option. Laundry is also included.

- All homestays are thoroughly checked the family is interviewed and the home inspected.
- All homestay providers sign a contract agreeing to rules and standards and undergo a vetting procedure by New Zealand Police.
- All students under 18 are visited in their accommodation quarterly by authorised accommodation assessors.
- All payments to the homestay provider are made via the UP Education Student Fees Trust.
- A 24-hour call centre number is provided in case of emergency.

#### Other accommodation options

You could also choose to:

- Live with your parents
- Live with a designated caregiver (relative or family friend)
- Live in university accommodation
- Live in the student apartments (for students 18 and over only this is the responsibility of the student or their parent/guardian or agent to arrange).

If you are under 18 at the start of your course, your accommodation arrangements must be approved by us.

Test description and instructions for test preparation are made available to all prospective candidates in advance, and a practice test is provided. Measures are taken to ensure the integrity of the test.
